These integrated tools handle everything from CAD sharing and markup to cloud storage and comprehensive change management, without the need for inhouse PDM maintenance.

The Pros and Cons

SOLIDWORKS PDM STANDARD

PROS

- Included with SOLIDWORKS Professional and Premium
- User-friendly with Windows Explorer integration
- Seamlessly integrates with **SOLIDWORKS**
- Easy upgrade path to PDM Professional

CONS

- Limited to one workflow with 10 states
- No replication for remote offices
- Lacks active directory login integration
- No API for external integration
- Limited scalability (relies on SQL Server Express)
- Requires a physical server, on-premise or via a third party

SOLIDWORKS PDM PROFESSIONAL

PROS


- Compatible with most major CAD programs
- Unlimited workflows and customization options
- Documented API for extensive system integration
- Supports archive and database replication for remote offices

CONS

- Document-centric rather than itemcentric
- Requires a separate Microsoft SQL Server Standard (or higher) license
- Needs a physical server, either onpremise or through a third party

SOLIDWORKS MANAGE

PROS

- Item-centric data management
- Includes process and project management features
- Provides detailed reports and custom dashboards
- Supports multiple bill of material variations
- Integrates with PDM Professional for comprehensive document and data management

CONS

- Requires a separate Microsoft SQL Server Standard (or higher) license
- Hosted on a physical server, either onpremise or by a third party
- Steeper learning curve compared to PDM Professional due to added features

3DEXPERIENCE PLATFORM

PROS


- Minimal setup needed
- Cloud-hosted
- No client-side installation required
- Accessible from any internet-connected device
- Integrates with SOLIDWORKS and Microsoft Office

CONS

- No workflow customization available
- Dependent on an internet connection
- No integration with ERP systems
- Limited configurability
- Supports revisions only, not versions

What License Type(s) Fit Your Company Needs?

SOLIDWORKS PDM VIEWER

 Basic license for viewing, reading, and printing files from the PDM vault.

SOLIDWORKS PDM CONTRIBUTOR

 Adds the ability to check files in/out, use the web client, and work with all file types.

SOLIDWORKS PDM CAD EDITOR

 Includes Viewer and Contributor features, plus access to PDM within SOLIDWORKS CAD.

SOLIDWORKS MANAGE VIEWER

 Allows viewing, searching, and printing within Manage, covering documents, data, dashboards, BOMs, and more.

SOLIDWORKS MANAGE CONTRIBUTOR

 Builds on viewer capabilities, adding management of processes, tasks, workflows, and non-CAD data.

SOLIDWORKS MANAGE CAD EDITOR

 Grants full access to all areas of SOLIDWORKS Manage, including CAD data creation and editing.
